**FROM POOR TO RICO** is a theatrical tour de force that offers audiences an opportunity to experience the Puerto Rico Caridad knew as a child growing up between the island and the Bronx, and reflections on Puerto Rico post-Hurricane Maria through her eyes as an Emmy-winning Nuyorican poet, musician, and storyteller.

From Poor to Rico is a powerful testament to the richness of Puerto Rican history and culture, the island and its people, who are displaced and oppressed, but fighting nonetheless. This is a love letter to Puerto Ricans everywhere, a diary entry of the diaspora, and a proverbial F-you in the fight to be free from the historical weight of colonization.

#### A note from the playwright:

After protests caused Governor Ricardo Rosselló to resign, after Hurricane Maria, after the Jones Act, and the infamous paper towels, after the lack of response from FEMA, amidst the corruption, schools closing, spikes in suicide rates, after 4000+deaths and the growing thousands of displaced Puerto Ricans, after tax loopholes that allow the 1% to buy up the island; after all of this, I still imagine a Puerto Rico that her children can return home to. While exploring how to decolonize my thinking, creating poetry, music and stories are the only way to help me navigate through these layers of trauma. The deeper I dig into my reality, the more I go From Poor To Rico.

Writer/Performer/Composer - Caridad De La Luz AKA "La Bruja" won an Emmy as Script Writer of the "Legacy of Puerto Rican Poetry" that aired on ABC during the National Puerto Rican Day Parade 2021. In January 2022, she became the Executive Director of the NUYORICAN POETS CAFE where she began her career in 1996. Winner of the Jerome Hill Artist Fellowship 2019-2020 and a 2021 David Prize finalist, Caridad balances a career of activism, education and entertainment. She has been one of America's leading spoken word poets for over 20 years and has received the Puerto Rican Women Legacy Award, The Edgar Allan Poe Award from The Bronx Historical Society and was honored as A Bronx Living Legend by The Bronx Music Heritage Center. She was presented with a Citation of Merit from The Bronx Borough President and named "Top 20 Puerto Rican Women Everyone Should Know".
